## READING PLANNING COMMISSION

June 10, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. at Reading City Hall. Present: Christine Gollnick, Chad Penney, Chuck Hartshorn, and Emma Everett. Also present later: Warren Bartels. Absent: Betty Blount. Also present: Ben Wheeler, Kym Blythe, and 5 guests. Chuck made a motion, seconded by Emma, to approve the May minutes. Motion carried 4-0. The agenda was accepted as presented.

Chris closed the regular meeting at 7:13 and opened a Public Hearing to consider a special land use permit by the Cooks for Reading Releaf at 429 N. Main Street. Mr. Cook arrived just after the Public Hearing was opened. It was generally felt that there wasn't enough information presented to move forward. Chuck made a motion, seconded by Emma, to close the Public Hearing. Motion carried 4-0.

NEW BUSINESS: Chuck made a motion, seconded by Emma, to table any action on a special land use permit at 429 N. Main Street until the July 8<sup>th</sup> meeting. Hopefully more information would be available. Motion carried 4-0. Emma made a motion, seconded by Chuck, that the City require a performance bond to continue the process for Reading Releaf at 429 N. Main Street. \$200,000 was recommended. Motion carried 4-0.

Main Street, was curious about the setbacks for the new building at 429 N. Main Street. Mr. Cook replied that it will be more than is required. Chris Crook, 419 N. Main Street, was interested in general information about the provisioning center. It was briefly shared what one is and the proposed building is a 30'x50' new structure with about 30 parking spaces. Mr. Thorpe was concerned about security. Security requirements for a provisioning center and a grow center were shared.
