July 27, 2015

Chris opened a hearing on the Historic Overlay District at 7:01 p.m. There were two items to consider: 1) façade improvements—the lower areas on the city buildings needs repair and brick will be used. 2) A new roof for the Reading Community Library—a metal replacement roof with various colors suggested has been requested. Discussion centered whether the better material to fit the Historic Overlay District would be a metal roof or asphalt shingles. We felt it would perhaps be helpful to have a little more information on what type of metal roofing material would be used. We did not want it having a pole barn feeling. The hearing was closed.

Chad made a motion to approve the plan for new brick at the City Hall. Motion carried 5-0. After a little more discussion, Warren made a motion, seconded by Chad, to not approve a metal roof due to concerns that one on that building would give it too much of a pole barn look, not in character with the Historic Overlay District downtown, and to approve asphalt shingles with the library choosing some textured look in a beige, brown, or some colonial red shade. Motion carried 4-1, with Chuck voting no.

Chuck made a motion, seconded by Chad, to approve the May minutes. Motion carried 5-0.

The agenda was approved.
